Dharamshala, July 6: Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang attended the 89th birthday celebration of His Holiness The 14th Dalai Lama at the Dalai Lama Temple in McLeodganj, today.

Upon his arrival, he was accorded a warm reception headed by Sikyong Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) Mr Penpa Tsering and members of CTA.

The Chief Minister expressed deep humility and honour at the celebration of the 89th birthday of His Holiness The 14th Dalai Lama. He further conveyed his heartfelt wishes and prayers for the long life and good health of His Holiness on behalf of the people of Sikkim.

"We have been fortunate to have His Holiness visit Sikkim at regular intervals, most recently in December 2023, following the devastating floods in October of the same year", the Chief Minister stated. "His gracious presence made our sufferings and difficulties bearable, bringing light after the darkness of the catastrophe", he added.

Highlighting the schemes 'Mero Rukh Mero Santiti', and 'Sishu Samriddhi Yojana', the Chief Minister emphasised the State's commitment to sustainable development and environmental conservation. 'Mero Rukh Mero

DC Namchi convenes meeting with NHIDCL and NHPC

Namchi, June 8: Ms Anupa Tamling DC Namchi chaired a meeting with National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL) and National Hydel Project Corporation (NHPC) at DAC, today.

The meeting had the presence of Mr Subhash Ghimirey ADC (Hq) Mr Karma Choda Bhutia Deputy Director (LR & DMD) along with the representatives from NHPC and NHIDCL Mohammad Tarique

(NHPC) and Mr Ish Tyagi Project Manager (NHIDCL).

During the meeting, the DC had an interactive discussion with both the representatives about the impending danger of landslides causing concern to people and transportation. The clogging of drains and formation of deep crevices on the road has also become a rising concern due to either falling off of boulders or roads being completely washed away.

Further, she urged both the

corporations to take necessary precautions like proper wall building, creating alternative routes in case of emergency, improving the drainage and channelling the water sources to safe outlets. She also mentioned the immediate use of tarpaulin in the sliding areas to avoid any form of risks.

ADC (Hq) suggested a joint inspection of the concerned areas and prepare preventive measures especially with the onset of monsoon.

DC Namchi chairs meeting with members of Zoonosis

Namchi, July 8: Ms Anupa Tamling DC Namchi chaired a meeting with members of Zoonosis at DAC Namchi, today.

Present during the meeting were Mr Gopal K Chhetri SDM (Hq), Dr SN Adhikari CMO Namchi, Miss Peggyla Venchugpa DFO (T) Namchi, Dr Urgen Sherpa MD Principal Chief Consultant-cum-DNO/ DSO, Mr Suraj Rai CEO Education and the members of the Zoonosis Committee.

It may be noted that the Zoonosis Committee is a conglomeration of different line departments that works for the wellbeing of animals and prevents outbreak of endemic.

The DC reflected on the emerging cases of bird flu, malaria, scrub typhus and so on. She suggested the committee members to focus on proper maintenance of statistics regarding deaths and encouraged conducting surveys, which can be collected and documented.

DSO spoke about the zoonotic diseases and its early documentation in Sikkim. He informed that the Intra Derma Vaccination was introduced instead of Intra Muscle for Rabies, which will be economically friendly and

accessible to everyone.

The Committee members raised concerns about the rising imbalance of ecosystem, which leads to the birth of zoonotic diseases. They also highlighted the rising concern like commercial production of drugs used for animals and eventually leading them to be drug resistant, improper sanitation of meat stalls, rising cases of water borne diseases and growing concerns regarding death by insect bites. They requested for regular surveys and wider spread of information through educational programmes at schools and institutions.

Awareness session on BNS

Pakyong, July 8: District Hub for Empowerment of Women, Pakyong District, conducted an awareness session on Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) at the office of One Stop Centre Pakyong, with the Mission Shakti executing officials, today.

The session was attended by Mrs Dikit Lepcha Deputy Director-cum-Social Welfare Officer (WCDD), Mrs Chong Choki Bhutia Central Administrator (One Stop Centre), Ms Sristika Sharma District Mission Coordinator (DHEW), and Call Operator (Women Helpline).

Also present were staff of One Stop Centre (OSC), Women Helpline, District Hub for Empowerment of Women (DHEW), and Women and Child Development Department. Mr Dhiren Subba, Advocate and Resource Person elaborated on the sections of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita with the focus on women-centric schemes and highlighted additional provisions of the BNS. Furthermore, the discussion delved into the rationale behind the transition from IPC to BNS with a historical context and case study.

Deputy Speaker (SLA) visits Mangarzong to inspect on-going project at Mangsari

Soreng, July 5: Ms Raj Kumari Thapa, Deputy Speaker (SLA) accompanied by Mrs Tila Devi Gurung Zilla Adhyaksha (Soreng district) and Mr Aditya Golay former MLA (Soreng-Chakung) conducted a joint inspection of the development of Mangarzong at Mangsari under Soreng district, today.

Also present were Mr CK Rana former Horticulture and Agricultural Chairperson-cum-President All Sikkim Manger Association (ASMA), Mr Neeraj Pradhan Principal Chief Engineer (Tourism), Mr Pratap Gautam Additional Chief Engineer (Tourism), Mr Mingma Tamang Additional Divisional Engineer (Tourism), Mr Bishnu Rana OSD (Tourism) Mr SK Sharma BDO Soreng, Officers from Tourism Department, Committee members from ASMA and private contractors.

The team took stock of the construction site and raised queries regarding its completion. Other related issues concerning the timely completion of the project, proper road connectivity, availability of basic facilities for visitors and so forth were

highlighted in a discussion held with the stakeholders.

Mr Aditya Golay suggested providing added facilities for tourist attraction that sustains in revenue generation for the local community along with the promotion of the cultural heritage of Mangar Community.

During her visit, she interacted with the concerned officials and stakeholders regarding the project's development and asked the concerned officials to expedite the completion of the project within the stipulated time.

Experts from NDMA and GLOF conduct comprehensive survey of landslide under Mangan District

Mangan, July 3: Experts from NDMA comprising of Deputy Commandant Mr Rajat Malhotra, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and Dr Piyush Gourav, Sr Consultant (GLOF) conducted a comprehensive survey of landslide affected areas from Mangshila to Naga, Sanklang and Phidang under Mangan District, today.

The visit was to conduct an extensive survey, assess the physical factors contributing to the landslides, propose mitigations and identify vulnerable areas. The visit was also to address the mental health and psychosocial support needed by the affected community. Subsequently, compiling a report which would be submitted to the higher authorities and the Ministry, respectively.

The team was assisted by Panchayats, Liaison Officer Deputy Director SSDMA along with ADC (Dev), SDM Dzongu, Deputy Director DDMA (North), BDO Mangan, 107 (BRO)

Captain and officials of line departments.

The team identified several key factors including heavy rainfall, steep slopes, challenging topography and unstable soil composition. Significant damage to infrastructure, including roads, houses and agricultural land was recorded. It was also reported that several houses were displaced and there was a notable impact on the locals.

102nd International Day of Cooperatives celebrated

Namchi July 7: Cooperation Department Namchi District celebrated 102nd International Day of Cooperatives at Ratna Jyoti Club, Samatar, Namchi District, today.

The programme was organised in collaboration with the Sikkim Milk Union, Samatar MPCS and Milk PCS.

The programme was attended by Mr Santa Kumar Rai Panchayat Vice President Poklok GPU as the chief guest in the presence of Mr Tikaram Chettri Ward Panchayat, Dr Neelkamal Pradhan, Joint GM, Sikkim Milk Union President, Manager and members of Samatar Milk and MPCS, Mr Puroswottom Pradhan, Additional Registrar, Joint RCS and Officers from the Cooperation Department.

Financial literacy programme and farmers awareness on dairy farming and milk production were also incorporated in the programme.

GM, Sikkim Milk Union threw light on awareness regarding dairy farming and milk production. He highlighted the benefits of cooperative farming and encouraged the farmers to take up systematic farming practices. In order to improve dairy production in Sikkim, the Union is coming up with an initiative called 'doorstep delivery of feed and fodder', to boost dairy farming, he added. He emphasised the farmers about hygienic cattle rearing and healthy feeding practices that will help improve the quality of milk production.

Additional Registrar deliberated on the theme 'Cooperatives build better future for all'. He encouraged the participants to attain 'Sahakari Se Samriddhi' (prosperity through cooperative) through cooperation and collective participation, which is a campaign slogan of the Ministry of Cooperation. He also motivated the villagers to come to a cooperative fold and

contribute to nation building

through cooperatives.

Mr Ajay Rai, Deputy Registrar informed that the celebration also marks the launching of a year-long celebration of the Golden Jubilee of Sikkim's statehood and a step forward towards joining the slogan 'Sunaulo ani Samriddha Sikkim'. This year's International Cooperative Day also coincides with the third anniversary of the formation of the Ministry of Cooperation, he informed.

Mrs Dhan Kumari Rai, Centre Manager, Centre for Financial Literacy, Jorethang presented a session on financial literacy incorporated in the programme. She highlighted the importance of saving and investment habits through practical demonstrations. She also threw light on some pivotal schemes such as- Atal Pension Yojana, Pradhan Mantri Jiwan Jyoti Bima Yojana, PM Suraksha Bima Yojana, Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, Kisan Credit Card, etc. She also alerted the participants from Fraud calls and SMSs.



- Standards, BIS (scale of helmets, pressure cookers, gas) for the safety of an individual.
- 3) Package commodities rule 2011
- 4) Legal Metrology Act 2009 (weighing, stamping)
- 5) LPG 2005 (visiting hotels, domestic/commercial cylinder).

The expired and sub standard products found violating the specifications mentioned in the above Acts and rules during the inspection were seized with the approval of DC Mangan, Mr Anant Jain.

DCSO strictly advised shopkeepers to return all the damaged items. He briefed them about the necessary proceedings as laid down in the above Acts and rules and stated that if they failed to comply, necessary action would be initiated against them.

In addition, he mentioned on the maintenance of the surrounding areas of Saramsa Garden and urged building a protective wall to avoid sinkage of the roads in vulnerable areas to avoid any calamity.

Proceeding further, the team inspected the areas from Aho-Mangkhim to the Andheri stretch wherein, water flowing channel is being disrupted due to the construction and the areas around the region are facing difficulties.

To resolve the issue, the officials of NHIDCL agreed to identify cross-drainages through a survey with the help of Panchayats and State authorities and cater the water to the right channel at the earliest.

It was also identified that the SPWD road towards Aho to Mangkhim has been obstructed, to which the Minister advised the concerned officials to work towards the clearance and restoration of the roads by deploying machines in the areas.

Additionally, DC Pakyong also emphasised under Section 34 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the need to ensure that the road is motorable by July 12, 2024.

Continuing the evaluation, the team also visited the Andheri road and checked the update on the road construction in the region. The team also took stock of the area around Basilakha road to determine paths so as to divert the direction of the natural water flowing to safeguard the underconstruction road from any accidents.

Proceeding further, the inspection team also visited Pastenga Gaucharan to Noapgaon PMGSY road at Assam Lingzey, wherein the retaining wall at RD 1.5 km has been totally damaged due to torrential rainfall. The officials of the department also informed that labourers have been assigned to remove stones from the damaged wall, which was posing hazards to the houses below.

An alternative diversion road has been proposed at kilometre 16, Chapter 13 to Chapter 16 along the Assam Lingzey Pakyong road near the 14-mile bridge in Pastenga. The existing road was found to be unstable, and due to the river below and continuous landslides, the road has triggered severe damage.

Mr Naween Gurung, SE Roads and Bridges Department, informed that a survey for the alternate road has been completed, and the cost estimate is being prepared for immediate submission to the department.

Further, the Minister instructed the Roads and Bridges Department to submit the estimate of permanent restoration at km 23 Ch 15 to 17 at Rong Rong Khola, Km 29 Ch 3 to 6, and km 29 Ch 23 to 25th along the Assam Lingzey-Pakyong SPWD road and advised them to work towards the maintenance of the road connectivity in the area.

DC Soreng chairs meeting on Water Drainage Mitigation

Soreng, July 5: A meeting focusing on the crucial issue of mitigating problems caused by surface runoff of water was held at Office of the District Collector Soreng today.

This meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Mr Dhiraj Subedi District Collector(DC) Soreng. The meeting saw the participation of Mr DR Bista ADC, Mr Gayas Pegha ADC (Dev.) Mr Sunny Kharel SDM (Soreng), Heads of Offices, Officers and officials from various line departments.

The primary focus of the discussions was on channelizing a proper way for water drainage to protect public properties, minimise

the damages and diverting the water route from Jautaar Stadium Complex to Rani Khola near Soreng. The key topics included were problems caused by the current drainage system, enhancement of existing jhoras to improve water flow and prioritization of water drainage system to handle surface runoff effectively.

Several important proposals were also put forward during the meeting such as formation of a Committee led by the DC to oversee the implementation of drainage solutions, development of a comprehensive Detailed Project Report (DPR), which would also include plans for a new

District Administrative Centre (DAC) building, conducting a preliminary survey by the field functionaries of the line and land revenue departments led by the RO/AD in-order to create a detailed route map for the drainage system and enhancing coordination with the Panchayats of Soreng and Mangsari Gram Panchayat Units

It may be noted that the upcoming coordination meeting has been scheduled for July 18, 2024 to further discuss and streamline the initiatives discussed followed by the inspection and survey by the team on July 19, 2024.

Minister Social Welfare Department said that the Nasha Mukt Sikkim campaign is multifaceted and designed to sustain momentum throughout the year, requiring the wholehearted support of all stakeholders to eradicate the drug menace from the state. To counter this, we need a well-knit Anti-Drug Strategy, he added.

He pointed out that stricter regulations and enforcement are vital to curb the sale and distribution of drugs. He added that increased patrolling and surveillance in areas prone to drug activities, along with enhanced cooperation between local law

enforcement and community organisations, will help reduce the drug menace.

Additionally, he highlighted the establishment of more rehabilitation centres to provide treatment and support for those battling addiction. He also urged the stakeholders to provide timely counselling services and helplines to provide immediate assistance and relief. He urged the departments, and all involved in this endeavour, active support and collaboration to make Nasha Mukt Sikkim Campaign a success.

Advisor, Social Welfare Department stated that Nasha Mukt Sikkim calls for an action for every citizen and it requires the combined efforts of all sectors of society, healthcare professionals, educators, law enforcement agencies, politicians, community leaders and families. She spoke about rehabilitation and support, a recovery journey that requires compassion and continuous support from the authorities, society and family. She said that the focus should be on educating society on the social stigma that going drug-free is an achievable target. She mentioned that integrating substance abuse treatment into the state's PHSCs, primary health care system, especially in rural areas, community involvement, local initiatives and people support can significantly enhance the impact.

Further, she added that collaboration with law enforcement agencies is needed to crack down on drug trafficking and ensure strict regulation of substances to build a society where youth can thrive, free from the shackles of addiction. Lastly, she urged all to take a pledge to support the Nasha Mukt Sikkim campaign to be incorporated into our daily lives.

Chief Secretary, said that Sikkim has been a torchbearer in many sectors like environmental issues, education, health and socio-economic upliftment, in spite of all these achievements our State is also not free from the serious issues ailing the society all over the world. He stated that with the launch of a very crucial and challenging crusade against alcoholism and drug abuse the Nasha Mukt Sikkim campaign, the day also marks an opportunity to introspect, contemplate, and deliberate on the mammoth difficulty every one is confronted with in recent times.

He expressed that the campaign aims understanding and formulating a comprehensive strategy aimed at mitigating drug abuse within the

He highlighted that drug abuse and addiction is a psychosocial-medical problem requiring a holistic approach, from prevention and early detection to effective intervention, rehabilitation and social integration. He also added that addiction not only affects individuals but also deeply

impacts the lives and morale of all those connected to them and that there is an urgent need for concerted efforts of all stakeholders to avert and eradicate this menace.

Schemes and programmes should effectively reach the target groups through partnerships with the private sector and civil society keeping with the evolving needs of the vulnerable sections of the society, he added.

He also appealed for a collaborative effort from the public and private entities, teachers, faithbased groups, health care providers, law enforcement officials, and all community leaders in furthering the cause of the Nasha Mukt Sikkim campaign in their respective areas to make a valuable contribution that could be far-reaching in realising the vision of 'Sunaulo and Samriddha Sikkim'.

Secretary Social Welfare Department presented an overview of Sikkim's substance abuse scenario through a detailed PowerPoint presentation. She highlighted the increasing trend of addiction, particularly among youth, identifying cannabis, cocaine, alcohol, inhalants, sedatives, and opioids as primary concerns.

She outlined the Sahayogi programme, which aims to build a stronger community response. In schools, as Sahayogi Mitra, students will prevent their friends from falling prey to drug abuse and provide necessary steps to assist them in seeking help. In government offices, as Sahayogi Karmachari, employees will advise their colleagues abusing substances to seek proper counseling and rehabilitation. At the village community level, as Sahayogi Aamas, women volunteers will spread awareness in the community and act as vigilantes to inform and prevent drug use and trafficking. As Sahayogi Sarathis, drivers will assist in preventing substance trafficking and spread awareness within their community.

Earlier, Dr Satish Rasaily, Senior Consultant, CAM informed about the status of Drug Abuse and Rehabilitation in Sikkim. The presentation focussed on the current prevalence, changing trends: extent and pattern and the consequences of substance

During the programme, the Speaker launched the Social Media page (Facebook/Instagram) established by Social Welfare Department along with a specific email ID under the name Nasha Mukt Sikkim. The department has designed the creatives of the campaign. The logo was also unveiled by the chief guest.

A grant-in-aid to the Deaddiction / Detoxification Centre was handed over by the chief guest and the dignitaries to various Rehabilitation Centres in the State.
